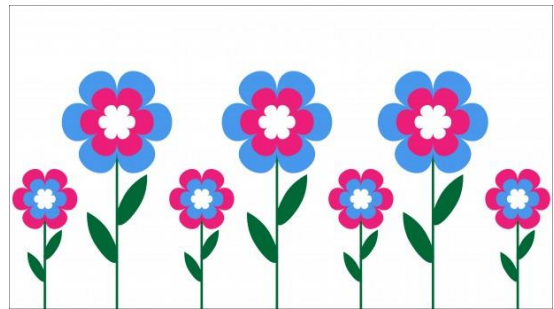

- ✓ Encourage Math and Science
 - Cooking, sewing, using a calculator, playing board games, estimating distances and amounts, and recognizing patterns in design and music are great ways to strengthen math skills.

- ✓ Encourage writing
 - Keep a summer scrapbook and write captions for each entry.
 - Start a journal. Write about what happened during the day/week.

- ✓ Read! Read! Read!
 - The number of books read in the summer is consistently related to academic gains.
 - Children read more when they see others reading. Parents can be models by letting their children see them reading for pleasure.

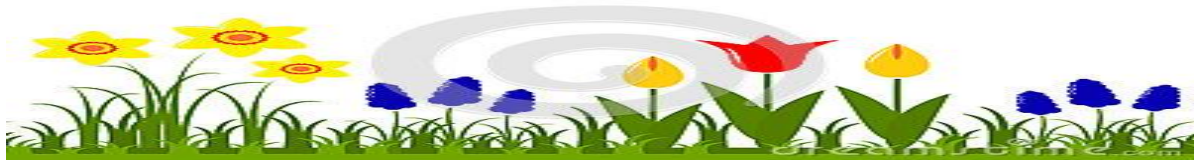
