- Continue to work on summarizing a story
- Examine the formal conventions for presenting information such as: examples, background material, speaker's names...
- Study the subordinating conjunctions
- Examine word origins as well as studying context to guess meaning...

Latin I:

Project Presentation - "Pyramus Et Thisbe' Part 2 ...

This week, we will study the second part of 'Pyramus Et Thisbe'. With this part of the story, students will:

- Extend their vocabulary
- Study the pronoun and adjective this and its declensions
- Study the demonstrative pronoun and adjective 'that' and its declension and inflected forms.
- Examine the imperative mode of all verbs
- Examine the rule of the accent with the antepenultimate.

Also, this week, the students will present their production to the classroom!
