### ***Art with Mrs. Searcy***



Kindergarten students will complete their graduation portraits this week and begin a Claude Monet water lily project.

1st Grade students will complete their narrative about their Wild Thing and begin a Vincent van Gogh Sunflower still life.

2nd Graders will review the elements of art as they create a Hundertwasser inspired piece. They will begin by making some painted paper using the warm and cool color families.

3rd Graders will work collaboratively to create symbols for their Rock Art panel. They will work in groups to create their pictograph inspired by local North Carolina petroglyphs and pictographs.

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4th Grade will complete their Cactus Still-Life this week with their review of the elements and principles of art. Also, we will have a guest speaker from the Rutherford County Cooperative to present the Farm City Connection Poster Contest winners on Thursday.

### **Life Skills with Mrs. Staley**

This week in Life Skills students will learn about finances, household expenses, and managing a checking account with the bank.

#### ***Kindergarten:***

Skills- Kindergarten students have been working diligently to complete Unit 9 in Skills. Assessments will take place this upcoming week. Students will be tested on the "Tricky Words", uppercase letters, and reading passages and sentences. Tricky words they need to know are: which, so, there, here, are, what, said, says, I, no, once, when

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Listening and Learning- Students are learning about Presidents and American symbols. They have learned about George Washington, but they will also learn about Thomas Jefferson, Abraham Lincoln, and a few other famous U.S. Presidents.

Math- It has been so fun to watch the kindergarten students apply number bonds to the learning of the teen numbers. We will continue to work on place value and practice counting by 10's to 100. Students will also learn how to represent numbers above 20 with tens and ones.

MAP TESTING FOR KINDERGARTEN will be on Thursday and Friday. Please make sure your child gets plenty of rest and a healthy protein-rich breakfast.

***First Grade:***

We are making huge strides to finish out our year strong! We have our end of the year MAP tests on Monday May 21st and May 22nd. Please try to practice math facts and keep reading at home! For our Listen and Learn (History) we are working through Frontier Explorers. We are learning how tough but important westward expansion was for the pioneers and Native Americans in the United States. We are starting a new reader called 'Grace'. Your children are practicing slowing down their reading and working on comprehension. In math we moving into understanding numbers up to 120! So, we will be revisiting number bonds and word problems.

***Second Grade:***

Next week in second grade we are reviewing for MAP testing, using the Core Knowledge Review for Language Arts and Math. We are continuing to learn about fractions and telling time in Eureka Math. We are beginning the novel of Peter Pan in class. We are also beginning research, reading biographies of famous people in history we have learned about during second grade. We have a very busy next three weeks .

***Third Grade:***


Next week third grade will be reviewing for our EOG's We will be working in our buckle down books on marking up the different types of passages students read. We are getting the students ready for EOGs by having them locate details and the main idea of passages. We MAP tested Monday and Tuesday. We have some students that need to make these up. These tests are important in that they help us identify what individual students need to work on.

Next week we will be working on capacity, mass and graphing. We are also reviewing our math standards. It is important for us to stay focused and ready to work the remainder of the year. Every student should be present and ready to work. We will also be doing a series of practice testing to get students acclimated to EOG testing.

***Fourth Grade:***

Reading - We are continuing Treasure Island. We are also working on text markups and EOG review.

Math - This week's review is fractions! We will look at equivalent fractions, comparing fractions, operations with fractions, improper fractions and mixed numbers. We are also going to look at converting fractions to decimals and vice versa with tenths and hundredths.



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Science - We are continuing energy with studying about light.

***Fifth Grade:***

CKLA- we are working correct comma usage in sentences, the prefix fore-, and review how to use proper verb tense in writing and speaking.

Math- We are learning about how to find the volume of shapes

Science- We are learning about Weather

Social Studies- We are learning about the Civil War

6th grade: Plant structures

7th grade: Layers of the Atmosphere

8th grade: Energy and Environmental Impact

***Ms. Cohen:***

In Social Studies this week, 6th graders will be learning about "Big Businesses and Labor" and the challenges of urbanization. We are still covering the inventions that were created during the 1900s, and the effects of the second Industrial Revolution had on American cities and farms. Sixth graders will have a vocabulary test on Wednesday 5/16/18. The word list has been posted to Google Classroom, Class Dojo, and my Quizlet link. For the Pen Pals project, 6th graders will be exploring the foods that their Pen Pals enjoy eating and which foods are considered local to their communities. As of this past week, 6th graders have pen pals from Argentina, New Zealand, Turkey, Norway and South Africa.

Students in 7th grade will continue their unit on World War II, but this week we will be examining the science and technology of the war. 7th graders will have a vocabulary test on Chapter 17 words

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Wednesday 5/16/18. Remember that these words are posted on Google Classroom, Class Dojo, and on my Quizlet account.

Students in 8th Grade will continue to learn about the 1960s. We will be completing a research project on the changes that occurred during the 60s, with a connection to the Vietnam War. Students will have a vocabulary test on Chapter 22 on Wednesday. I have uploaded the chapter onto Google Classroom, as well as the vocabulary for the chapter.

**Ms. Quesinberry:**

Next week, 6th grade will be wrapping up Statistics and Probability, 7th Grade will be finishing Angles and Triangles, and 8th grade will finish reviewing the Real Numbers System. All classes will be engaging in EOG review with an emphasis on Expressions and Equations.

**Mrs. Long:**

8th Grade Art: Next week the students will be focusing on Architecture Since the Industrial Revolution; learning about Modern Architecture and designing International Style buildings.

8th Grade Creative Arts: Students are working on re-creating their own children's stories by modernizing them or putting their own spin on them. They will be creating scripts out of these stories and performing them in front of the class.

High School Non-Western Art History is going to be creating presentations based on an aspect of Japanese culture that they researched.

Math 1: Quadratics Unit
