Title : Academic Probation and Extracurricular Eligibility

ACADEMIC PROBATION:

Students who have an F in any class at the end of the first or second trimester grading period will be placed on academic probation and will be barred from taking part in any extracurricular activities the following trimester. Students who have an F in any class as an end-of-year grade will be placed on academic probation and will be barred from taking part in any extracurricular activities during the first trimester of the next academic year.

Students will be removed from academic probation if at the end of the next trimester grading period they did not receive an F in any class.

Academic probation begins on the day after end of **trimester** grades are **posted to the Powerschool system.**

Students on academic probation need to maximize time spent on schoolwork and are not permitted to take part in any regularly scheduled after-school extracurricular activities, including clubs, athletic teams, drama productions, or similar activities **during the entire following trimester.** Students on academic probation are permitted to attend dances and field trips.

Students placed on academic probation **are strongly encouraged to** attend tutoring

Students may be assigned mandatory tutoring by school administration, per consultation with teacher(s) and/or activity sponsor(s).

Grade-level parent conferences: Whenever a student is failing two or more classes at the end of a trimester, a grade-level parent-teacher conference will take place unless two such documented conferences have already taken place.

TJCA-CFA is committed to making every effort to help every student succeed while recognizing that at times the voluntary decision of parents and guardians to transfer their children to another school may be in the best interest of meeting some students' educational needs.

Retention: Students in grades K-4 may be retained at the discretion of a committee of the grade teachers, guidance counselor and the principal. Students in grades 5-8 who fail two or more core classes and students in grades 9-12 who fail three or more classes will be placed in the same grade the following year. At the discretion of the administration, students in grades 9-12 who fail two classes may also be placed in

the same grade the following year. High school students must repeat any required class they have failed, even if they are not retained in the same grade.
